**Richard Youngs** is a senior associate in the Democracy and Rule of Law Program, based at Carnegie Europe. He is an expert on the foreign policy of the European Union, in particular on questions of democracy support. He has published widely on the Middle East, the European neighborhood, the current EU crisis, and energy security.

Youngs is also a professor of international relations at Warwick University. Prior to joining Carnegie in July 2013, he was director of the Madrid- and Brussels-based think tank FRIDE. He also held positions in the UK Foreign and Commonwealth Office and as an EU Marie Curie fellow. He was senior fellow at the Transatlantic Academy in Washington, DC, from 2012 to 2013. He obtained his BA (Hons) at Cambridge University and his MA and Ph.D from Warwick University.

Youngs's interests focus on the development of EU foreign policy, European responses to the Arab Spring, trends in international democracy, and current debates over democracy promotion strategies. He has written several books on different elements of European external policy and published over forty articles and working papers, while writing regularly in national and international media. His latest work and seventh book, *The Uncertain Legacy of Crisis: European Foreign Policy Faces the Future*, was published in January 2014.

**Stephanie B. Anderson** B.S.F.S. (Georgetown), M.Sc. (Econ), Ph.D. (Cantab.) is associate professor of political science and adjunct professor of international studies and gender and women's studies at the University of Wyoming. More recently, she was a senior fellow at the Free University of Berlin researching EU security and defence policy, identity-formation, and crisis management. Her book, *Crafting EU Security Policy: In Pursuit of a European Identity* (Boulder, CO: Lynne Rienner, 2008) is based on research undertaken as a Senior Fulbright Research Scholar at the German Institute for International and Security Affairs (SWP). Her first Fulbright was as a Senior Scholar in the Graduate School of International Studies at Sogang University in Seoul, Korea. She has also published in several journals and edited volumes including *Armed Forces and Society* and *European Foreign Affairs Review*.

Prof. Anderson is the winner of seven teaching awards and was twice honored as the University of Wyoming's "Top Prof". Prof. Anderson was also elected to the European Union Studies Association's (EUSA) Executive Committee (1997-1999) and as Co-Chair of the European Union as a Global Actor interest section (2007-2011). In addition, she is an outside reviewer for the European Science Foundation (ESF) and serves on the UK's Marshall Scholarship Selection Committee. She was also made a Next Generation Fellow of the American Assembly, an affiliate of Columbia University, with the mandate to illuminate issues of public policy. His current research interests focus on global financial and monetary policy, the European Union (in particular monetary union and trade policy), EU-China relations, and transatlantic relations. **Professor Kurt Hübner** holds the Jean Monnet Chair for European Integration and Global Political Economy and the Chair for German and European Studies at the Institute for European Studies, the University of British Columbia (UBC), Vancouver, Canada. Central to his research are topics on global and European currency regimes, European trade policies and the relations between innovation, global competitiveness and sustainability. His latest research focuses on the economic and socio-political bases of the ongoing negotiations on the Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) between the EU and Canada; his book on CETA has just been released with Routledge. Currently he is working on a project on currency competition and currency co-operation, which analyses the relations between the U.S. Dollar, the Euro and the Renminbi. This research will be published in the 2nd half of 2011.

He is the chief contributor of The Globalist (USA) on G-20 economies and global corporations. And he also contributes briefs to the Project Syndicate, the world's pre-eminent source of original op-ed commentaries, whose membership includes 442 leading newspapers in 150 countries.

Dr Steinbock is a Senior ASLA-Fulbright Scholar (New York University, Columbia Business School). He serves as Visiting Professor at the Shanghai Foreign Trade Institute and is in the high-level Guidance Group of the GeoBranding Center (CMO Council) dedicated to the marketing of countries, and locations worldwide. The interest communities of the CMO Council include over 20,000 global executives across nearly 100 countries. He also he has advisory tasks in 1to1 Magazine, Fortune, BusinessWeek, McKinsey Quarterly Online Executive Panel, African Journal of Business Management, and so on.
